Did you know Spencer once generated its own electricity?

Today, the North Canadian River flows by the City of Spencer like a stream, barely rising enough to float a boat. In Spencer's early days, the river flowed high and steady. It was used to transport barges that hauled freight and brought local crops to market. The strong current also brought electricity to our small but growing community.

The Canadian River Water Power Company was located west of the train tracks, just off the Main Street curve into downtown Spencer. The power plant used a water wheel and a system of gears to spin the turbines at high speed.

In 1909, Spencer had about 300 residents, with another 1,100 in the surrounding township. The plant was sized just right to provide reliable power to this small population. Spencer had electricity before much of Oklahoma City.

Next to the generating plant was a waterpowered grist mill. The grist mill ground local wheat into flour for baking and produced middling for animal feed. A milldam was built to shift some of the water flow to the power plant and mill without interrupting river traffic.

The power plant ran until the 1930's, when it ceased operations due its generating to capacity being too small to meet the demand. OG&E's distribution

network had also expanded into eastern Oklahoma County and beyond.

If you or someone you know has old tires that need to be discarded in a safe and environmentally friendly way. you can drop them off any time at the Spencer PW barn. located at 3550 McCoy Drive, 73084. Tires MUST be recyclable and follow these requirements:

- No tires with rims will be collected during the event.
- No tires will be collected from any other source or event. (such as tire dealerships. salvage vards, service stations, etc.) .
 - No exempt tires will be collected. (such as forklift, offroad, heavy machinery, backhoe tires, etc.)
- No tire shreds, pieces, burnt tires, or commingled trash will be accepted.
- Tires must be rollable and will only be collected for specified reasons.

CITY OF SPENCER DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Utility: We at the utility Dept. are continuously working on building a friendly yet professional relationship with our residents so that they feel they can trust us and reach out with any questions or concerns they may have. We have also improved our billing process to provide customers with consistent utility bills every month. We've reinforced other methods like payment arrangements to help customers in need. In addition to that, using our Meter system, we can provide our customers with accurate meter reading information and warn customers when a leak may be happening at their property so they can take care of the problem and avoid a high-water bill.

Police: 2022 officers were certified as crisis officers to help with the growing mental health concerns in our community. Also, 2 New patrol cars were added to our aging fleet. The Fleet was last updated in 2016. We also added new officers to the department to assist in the call volume. Currently, in 2023, the Spencer police station is under renovation. The police station hasn't been updated since 2000. In addition, we added 2 New reserve officers to help with the department's workload. All of our officers completed a bias training class in 2022.

Animal Control: Animal Control has a new facility we will be moving into on April 1, 2023. To help with the dog and large animal overflow. We have a new animal control officer for the animal control department. He will attend the animal control academy this month and is training with Midwest city.

Code: Code Enforcement is focused on building relationships, quality workmanship, and excellent communication with residents, the public, commercial builders, and contractors by networking positively. CE has brought forward new construction by developing 70 new residential housing for the community working with LLW Development. Also, (10) new residential housing has come to Spencer with the help of Oklahoma Central Habitat for Humanity. CE strives to have a strong relationship with residents and proactively works to keep properties clean and clear. Code Enforcement took on a new role as Floodplain Manger working with the Oklahoma Water Resource Board and being active and working diligently with the community and board members. Also, when necessary, Code is volunteering service with other departments when needed. The overall focus of Code Enforcement is continued education for Building Inspectors, Electrical, Plumbing, and HVAC inspectors, and planning and zoning staff representative.
